Code of Conduct Purpose

The MCC Code of Conduct reflects our core values and outlines the expected behaviour and conduct for all members and supporters of MCC.

Scope

This code of conduct applies to all members of MCC and those providing support during club events such as training, races, and organised social activities, including:

- Persons acting on behalf of the club
- Athletes, riders, coaches, managers, support persons, and parents/guardians of junior members
- Participants in MCC or AusCycling-sanctioned events or activities
- Officials, Commissaires, and support personnel involved in MCC or AusCycling events
- MCC-appointed delegates, officials, committee members, volunteers, and employees

Key Principles

- Respect: Show consideration for others' physical and emotional well-being and property.
- ➤ Harassment-Free Environment: Maintain an environment free from any action directed at an individual or group that creates a hostile, intimidating or offensive environment.
- Non-Discrimination: Treat everyone equally, respecting the dignity and worth of every individual regardless of gender, ethnic origin, or religion.

Midland Cycle Club (MCC) Code of Conduct Policy

Policy Statement

All individuals bound by the Midland Cycle Club (MCC) Code of Conduct are required to adhere to the following standards of behaviour and conduct. These standards reflect our commitment to maintaining a respectful, supportive, and inclusive cycling community.

Standards of behaviour and conduct

Alignment with Club Interests: Act in a manner that aligns with and promotes the interests of MCC. This includes prioritising the club's goals, initiatives, and overall mission in all activities and decisions.

Uphold Reputation: Act in ways that uphold and enhance the standing and reputation of cycling and MCC within the broader community. This includes demonstrating sportsmanship, integrity, and professionalism.

Compliance with Anti-Doping Rules: Adhere strictly to the Anti-Doping Rules as outlined in the AusCycling Anti-Doping Policy. This includes not using or promoting the use of banned substances.

Courtesy and Respect: Treat all individuals involved in cycling, whether they are members, competitors, or spectators, with the utmost courtesy and respect. This includes being polite, considerate, and fostering an environment of mutual respect.

Respect for Property: Handle others' property with care and consideration, ensuring that no damage or misuse occurs. This applies to both personal belongings and club property.

Commitment to Policies: Adhere to all policies, rules, procedures, guidelines, and agreements set forth by MCC and AusCycling.

Legal and Customary Respect: Respect the laws and customs of the places visited during club activities, whether local or international. This includes obeying local regulations and respecting cultural practices.





Confidentiality: Maintain the confidentiality of sensitive information received during duties. This includes safeguarding personal data and proprietary information from unauthorised disclosure.

Proper Use of Funds and Property: Ensure that funds and property belonging to MCC or other parties are used responsibly and for their intended purposes. Avoid any form of misappropriation or misuse.

Asset Use: MCC assets or equipment must not be used for personal or financial gain unless explicitly approved in writing by the committee.

Appropriate Attire: Individuals engage in volunteer or paid roles must wear MCC or plain clothing while on duty to maintain a professional appearance and represent the club appropriately.

Coach Identification: When undertaking coaching duties coaches must wear MCC kit/clothing. If MCC kit/clothing is not available due to circumstances outside of the coaches control then plain/neutral kit/clothing is to be worn.

Rider Attire: Riders participating in MCC training sessions or rides are encouraged to wear MCC kit.

Conflict of Interest: Members in leadership or support roles must report any conflicts of interest real or perceived to the Club Secretary.

Engaging with Children: When interacting with a person under 18 years old maintain professionalism and follow best practices to ensure their safety and avoid any allegations of inappropriate behaviour.

Safe Environment: Ensure that all decisions and actions contribute to a safe, inclusive, and harassment-free environment. This includes being vigilant about safety protocols and promoting a welcoming atmosphere.

Care for Injured Riders: When interacting with injured riders, assess the situation carefully, provide assistance within your training, and seek medical help if necessary,
